11. Broadband

Cllr Mrs Kendell advised she has had contact from Openreach, they are awaiting information from the Department of Digital, Culture, Media and Sport about funding, all applications are currently on hold. Cllr Mrs Kendell will keep in contact with Openreach. Cllr French thanked Cllr Mrs Kendell for her tenacity.

12. Glebe Field/Landstrom

Cllr French and Cllr Mrs Kendell held an informal village surgery via Zoom to allow residents to raise any queries/questions they may have re Glebe Field. Cllr Mrs Kendell has kept a record of the meeting; all Cllrs have a copy as does the Clerk. Cllr Mrs Kendell will draft a letter which will be sent to every household in the village, explaining what the Parish Council knows to date and the options available to every resident.

The Clerk advised she has received a letter from Landstrom, all Cllrs have been sent a copy. The Clerk has sent a holding letter, advising Landstrom it is likely their letter will be dealt with at the Parish Council meeting in July.

Cllr Cutts advised The Birdingbury Club has also been approached by Landstrom. The Club do not wish to move from their present location in the middle of the village, therefore they will not be supporting Landstrom.

After a discussion, including representations from a member of the public, the Clerk was asked to write to the Diocese of Coventry to confirm Landstrom are acting on their behalf as no formal introduction from the Diocese has been received.

13. Roads and Kerbs within the village

The following were agreed as being in poor repair, the Clerk will send the information to WCC Highways for their attention and ask for the areas to be inspected and for the Parish Council to be advised of the outcome of the inspection.

Most Serious

Stockton Road from grid ref 434635 southwards, both sides - potholes and crumbled road edges, almost continuous

Long Itchington Road from Davenport Farm southwest to district boundary - potholes at intervals on both sides, worse on NW side nearer to district boundary.

Serious - danger to cars

Bourton Road at grid ref 430687, south side of the road on church side of bend - long and deep rut at road edge

Long Itchington Road at grid ref 431679, SE side of road - long and deep rut at road edge

Long Itchington Road from 427676 to 423673, both sides - range of 15-20 separate potholes / crumbled edges

Issues currently known about and are in hand

Water emerging from Back Lane

Birdingbury Bridge - collapse

Verge in Main St – repaired following work, however, all the new soil and grass seed has been washed away.

New tarmac and steep edges created in Stockton Road.
