The Birbury - this is the village community room, used for village meetings and available for hire, generally at no cost (contact Suzie at the Club). There are three Trustees – a Parish Council nominee (Guy French), a PCC nominee (Dick Withington) and a Club nominee (Tony Flint).

We have a **Community Cafe**, run by village volunteers, which is open Tuesday mornings from 10.30am to 12 noon in Birdingbury Club and the Birbury. We serve a good range of coffees and teas, and offer homemade cakes and savouries. Donations are suggested at £2 per person, and excess funds are donated to a variety of charities.
